

Level 1 = Falls into the bottom 5% of schools


Level 2 = Falls between 5% and 15% of schools

Priority and Focus school designations were based on 2011-12 data. Model school designations were based on 2013-14 data.

Focus Schools are high poverty schools that were ranked in the bottom 5% -15% of Title I-A schools in the state with a significant

achievement gap based on Oregon's rating formula. These schools need additional support in closing the achievement gap among historically
