What Happened?

School Spotlight

Principal Jonathan Steinhoff kicked off the School Spotlight series by speaking about Restorative Practices at **Fairview Elementary**. He discussed the Three Ds (Defiance, Disrespect, and Disruption) and the percentage of referrals that this behavior represents, and how they hope to improve assessment and response in order to provide support.

Principal Aaron Ferguson of **Reynolds Learning Academy** (RLA) spoke to the board about the school's First Steps program, which supports RLA's parenting students by providing a parenting class, access to a Head Start Family Support Specialist, and free preschool for their children.

Volunteer/Community Partner Recognition

SchoolHouse Supplies provided teachers from Alder, Davis, Wilkes, Hartley and Glenfair with free school supplies this year. Executive Director Alice Forbes said that they hope to serve all Reynolds schools next year.

High School Reporters

Reynolds High School (RHS) reporter Vanessa Valencia Lopez spoke to the board about Homecoming Week, a fundraiser with Black Rock Coffee Bar, and the upcoming Living History Day event on November 8. RLA reporter Joshua Ross discussed recent school field trips, the new volleyball team, and fall conferences and dinner.

Members of the Public

RSD parent Julie Phillips addressed the board regarding a 4th/5th grade classroom blend and a teacher who left to take a position at another RSD school.

Presentation to the Board

Principal Ferguson and RHS Principal Wade Bakely spoke to the board about school trips. RLA is exploring hands-on learning with a trip to IBEW to learn about electrical and lineman trades. RHS is planning their annual trip to the Malheur Field Station and a trip to the State Thespian Festival in Salem, OR.

Board Reports

The board heard reports from the Reynolds Education Foundation and the Citizen Oversight Committee, plus the Owner's Report. During Board Member Announcements, members spoke about their visits to RSD schools and attendance at district-related events, such as the middle school alumni soccer game.

Superintendent's Reports

Dr. Diaz spoke about the new Listen and Learn entry plan, providing excellence to the RSD community, engaging local businesses, working on her five goals, recognizing Fairview, Wilkes and Troutdale staff for making the difficult transition to a new building, and the Verizon Innovative Learning grant. Kate McLaughlin gave the Student Behavior Reponse Committee report, and Jennifer Ellis gave the Annual Staff Demographics report. The Enrollment report described student numbers, with enrollment down 351 students from this time last year, and how this impacts the district. The Financial report went over labor costs, general funds, expenditures, revenue projections, and the Bond Fund. The Communications report discussed the district's work on the website, social media, branding, and community engagement.

Consent Agenda

It was moved to approve the consent agenda as presented. The board voted and the agenda was approved unanimously.

Action Items

Resolution 2018-2019-004 regarding National Principals Month was unanimously approved. Resolution 2018-2018-005 proclaiming the celebration of National Native American Heritage was also unanimously approved. It was moved to approve the 2018-2019 Supported and the board voted unanimously in favor. Overnight field trips for RHS and RLA were unanimously approved.
