Welcome and Opening Remarks

Karina Ruiz opened the meeting, reviewed the agenda and group agreements. She also reviewed the last meeting, and some brief updates on the project.

Build a Bond Activity

The group was given an Excel spreadsheet with a breakdown of project cost estimates. These had been developed by Heidi and Jen, to help the group get an idea of how much each project might cost. Once the group prioritizes the projects and comes up with a short list of projects, more definitive cost estimates can be generated. Jen noted that these costs are very rough estimates (for the purpose of this activity), and that more definitive costs will be determined once projects are prioritized.

Two small groups prioritized projects for the \$275 million package, and a second priority tier (for additional items, should additional funding become available).

Group 1

- Exterior Lighting (\$200,000)
- Lead/Asbestos Mitigation district-wide (\$9,249,460)
- Electrical upgrades district-wide (\$3,260,471)

- Perimeter Fencing at HS (\$322,647)
- Perimeter Fencing at ES (\$412,067)

Priority 2 (if additional funding should become available):

- HVAC Replacement/Indoor Air Quality at HS (\$24,981,683)

Comments from the group:

- We removed two items (Exterior Window Replacement at Mt. Scott ES (\$12,694), and New Covered Play at Alder and David ES (\$691,387)), assuming that they would be covered in the replacement of those elementary schools.
- We felt that we could potentially accomplish all projects, except for HVAC improvements. With removing the projects that would be covered in the replacement, Priority 1 totals \$260,611,311.
- HVAC improvements are our second priority level, but we feel that there could be additional grants for HVAC.

Group 2

Priority 1 (\$274M package)

- Replace Alder ES (incl. demo) (\$44,033,18)
- Replace Davis ES (incl. demo) (\$36,242,856)
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Priority 2(if additional funding should become available):

- Intruder Locks District-wide (\$637,920)
- Replace Generators district-wide (\$2,788,020)
- Electrical upgrades district-wide (\$3,260,471)
- Replace and Repair Roofs (\$15,466,584)
- Replace Plumbing fixtures & piping district-wide (\$20,974,119)

Comments from the group:

- Our top priority is replacing the oldest elementary schools. Those four projects total \$164,916,874.
- The rest of our Priority 1 projects, including the replacements, total \$286,792,662. We know that's over the total, but we feel it's close enough for government work (especially as some costs will be adjusted as they will be covered in the replacement projects).
- We started to adjust some of the costs of the other projects in Priority 2 because they would be covered in the replacement.
- We did feel that HVAC improvements would be a big selling point of the bond, and would appeal to voters throughout the district.
- Could some of the Priority 2 projects be covered by the District's budget? Perhaps there could be money allocated to maintenance and improvements.

Karina noted that the groups are both aligned around prioritizing the replacement of the oldest four elementary schools. She asked the group, with the HVAC improvements, do you have priorities among the elementary, middle and high schools that are left?

- Would be good to look at the places where we are spending the most money on maintenance.
- It'd be good to prioritize the ones that are in the worst shape.
- The middle school is probably one of the worst off.

• There's also a very old stack of HVAC in the old building at RHS, which causes a lot of problems.

Karina told the group that at their next (and final) meeting, they can see updated dollar amounts on projects. She noted that in summary, it sounds like the group's priorities are the four new schools, the grandstands, and some of the other bigger projects, and then see how much HVAC you can buy. There are some outstanding questions on the stadium (and whether it's feasible at the RHS site) that need to be clarified, as well.

The group briefly discussed putting replacing Reynolds Middle School back on their list of projects, and noted that this would likely be a trade for replacing two elementary schools. This could be discussed at the next meeting further.

Next Steps

Karina reviewed the next steps with the group:

• The group will reconvene soon to review the final package recommendations, with the associated updated costs.

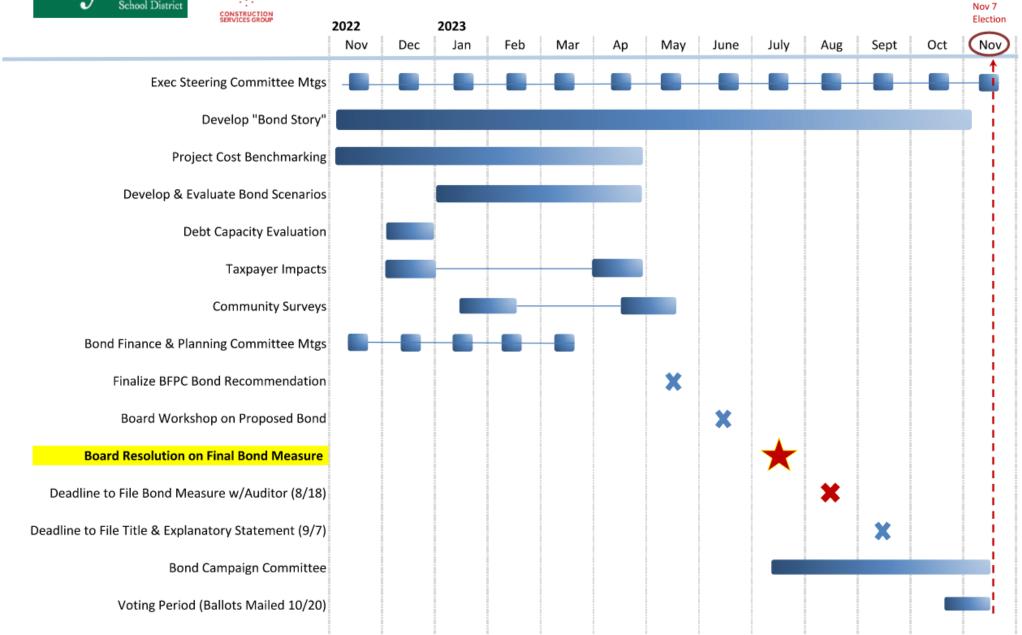
