



Why are Parent-Teacher Conferences Important?



Build a strong Partnership

These meetings help parents and teachers work as a team to support the child's learning and development.

Teachers learn more about the child's background, strengths, and challenges from the parent's perspective.

Understand Your Child's Progress

You get clear information about your child's:

- Academic performance (reading, math, writing, etc.)
- Behavior and participation
- Social skills and emotional wellbeing

You can ask questions and get specific feedback.

Identify Support Early

If your child is struggling, the teacher can suggest:

- · Extra help or tutoring
- · Special education services
- Behavior or emotional support

Early action can make a big difference in your child's success.



Meeting with the teacher and Interpreter

If English is not your first language, meeting with an interpreter can make the experience much more comfortable and effective.

Benefits of Using an Interpreter:

- You can express yourself clearly in your native language.
- You'll understand everything the teacher says—no confusion or guessing.
- You can ask more detailed questions and get accurate answers



Tips for a Successful meeting

- Request an interpreter in advance: Let the school know your preferred language.
- Speak directly to the teacher: Even though the interpreter is translating, look at and talk to the teacher.
- Take notes: Write down important points or next steps.
- Ask for written materials: If possible, ask for documents in your language or use translation tools at home.
