School and Community:

Reynolds High School is a comprehensive, traditional four-year public high school serving over 2,500 students in grades 9-12. Located at the mouth of the beautiful Columbia River Gorge in Troutdale, Oregon, Reynolds School District serves five smaller suburban towns in the Greater Portland metropolitan area and includes 11 elementary schools (K-5), three middle schools (grades 6-8), one alternative high school (grades 9-12) and Reynolds High School (RHS), which currently has the second largest student body at a traditional public school in the state of Oregon. Reynolds High School is accredited by the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools and a member of the College Board.

Reynolds has a comprehensive English Language Learners (ELL) program, providing services to approximately 450 students who speak more than 40 different languages. The composition of the student body is as follows:

Academic Programs:

Reynolds High School offers a diverse program of studies for all students. Along with standard and advanced course offerings in the core academic subjects of Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies, students can pursue areas of interest in the Arts (Visual and Performing), Career Technical Education (CTE), Wellness and World Languages (Spanish and French).

College Now Dual Credit Program: provides high school students the opportunity to earn high school and college credits simultaneously through Mt. Hood Community College (MHCC). Selected courses are taught at Reynolds High School by teachers who are certified and approved by MHCC.

Middle College: a cooperative program between Mt. Hood Community College and Reynolds High School that allows RHS juniors and seniors to take a full-time college course load (up to 12 credits per term) at MHCC during the Fall, Winter, and Spring terms. Students earn dual credit toward their high school diploma and their desired college certificate or degree.

Senior Inquiry: a dual credit, year-long program offered in partnership with Portland State University (PSU). Students are exposed to a rigorous course of academic study focusing on delivering interdisciplinary college-level courses on-site at RHS, preparing students for the unique demands and rewards of college coursework. Senior Inquiry is team-taught by high school and university faculty and is programmed on a block schedule. It affords successful completers the opportunity to earn up to 15 university credits.

Rank Order and GPA:

Reynolds High School computes class rank and GPAs on both a weighted and unweighted basis. Unweighted rank and GPA is calculated based on the cumulative grade point average of all classes based on a four-point scale. Weighted GPA is recalculated with a weighted differential based on a five-point scale for AP/Honors and select dual-credit courses. The highest weighted GPA for the class of 2019 was 4.361.
