

WELCOME TO AN AMAZING SEMESTER OF PAINTING AND LEARNING TECHNIQUES TO CREATIVE PROBLEM SOLVING AND CRITICAL THINKING THROUGH THE WORLD OF ART

In your pre-requisite class, you learned the Elements and Principles of Design; Contour Drawing; Value and Shading: Self-Portrait; Perspective; Still-Life working with Graphite and Charcoal. This year in "Painting" we will introduce color, with a variety of mediums such as colored pencil, pastel, as well as being introduced to painting using different mediums such as watercolor, acrylic, and oils.

Course Objectives:

- -Develop a working knowledge of the Elements and Principles of Design.
- -Develop eye/hand coordination and ability to see as an Artist.
- -Develop an understanding of composition and picture plane, implied line, value and the ability to create the illusion on a 2-D plane.
- -Drawing is a patient subject and it can be learned, we will take stepping stones to building these skills so you will become more confident as an artist.

Assessment:

- -Students are graded on completed projects which may include the following:
- -The creative use of the Elements and Principles of Design.
- -The overall quality and craftsmanship of the artwork produced.
- -The care and maintenance of tools, equipment, and work area.
- -The effort exhibited in the production of your Artwork.
- -Learning Goals and Assessments.
- -Scoring Guides.
- Completing a project does not mean just doing something as quickly as possible and turning it in for a grade. Your assignments must be on the proper subject matter and include plan, forethought, and good design. Always strive to do your best...PERSONAL BEST.
- Taking an Art Class is a <u>privilege</u>. Being Creative, Imaginative, and Expressive in your own individual way is what Art is all about, it also teaches you to Visualize. This is a skill that will help you with your future endeavors as a "Life-Long Learner."

- Students will be expected to exhibit the Highest Quality of Effort, Creativity, and Artistic Discipline. Which means ability to commit yourself to your Artwork, never getting distracted or be a distraction to others.
- I do not give homework, all work is done during class, which is why being present is important to your success in this class. <u>Poor attendance will seriously affect the quality of your projects and your participation/performance points.</u> Excellent attendance is necessary to succeed in this class,



Classroom Conduct

- -Work **QUIETLY** this has a lot to do with the SUCCESS of your projects, I will educate you in why that is a factor.
- -If you are TARDY you need to have a pass, excessive tardies will not be tolerated.

-BACKPACKS OFF THE TABLES.

- -Clean up your work area every day, as well as any area you used.
- -General room cleanup will be assigned daily that is part of classroom procedures.
- -Have necessary material in class each day.
- -Pass procedures: you must have your PLANNER.

YOU WILL BE GRADED DAILY:

- Be in class on time, participate during class critiques, be present for demonstrations knowing what information you need to know for class projects.
- Dailly performance and utilizing your classroom time.
- Following class and school expectations.
- Artistic Discipline.
- At the end of the period stay seated until the bell rings.

• GENERAL DISCIPLINE:

- First warning: verbal warning
- Second warning: is a call home
- Third: will be a written referral to administration

This applies to general discipline if the situation presents itself, it could be an automatic written referral to administration.

- PROJECTS: 100 PTS.
- ROUGH DRAFT: 50 PTS.
- HAND-OUTS: FROM 10 TO 50 PTS.
- PARTICIPATION POINTS: 25 PTS.
