**Required Textbooks/Materials:** School issued computer; Wayside Publishing's *Entre Culturas* Level 1 FlexText and online materials; pens (blue or black ink); pencils; paper; two spiral type notebooks or composition books, one for a journal, one for a dictionary (students can use regular paper or an online format for both the journal and the dictionary if they prefer).

Course Description: Spanish 1 introduces basic Spanish vocabulary, grammar and culture. By the end of the year students will be expected to achieve the language proficiency described by Benchmark 1 in the State Department of Education Standards. Students will aquire these skills through communicative activities which will include written and oral(speaking) assessments, films, games, and music. Students will be expected to demonstrate proficiency through a range of activities such as interviews, written projects, or oral presentations.

**Course Requirements**: Complete all activities, homework, presentations, projects, quizzes, exams, etc. on time and to the best of your abilities. Maintain your portfolio and keep it up to date. Semester/Final Exams or projects will follow school policies and timelines.

**Grading Policy Description**: All activities, assignments, projects, quizzes and exams will be placed into one of these categories: POWER, Homework, Classwork, and Mastery. Summative quizzes and tests will be in the Mastery Category. Most activities will be in the Homework or Classwork sections. All assignments, etc., will have a point value. Your grade will be based on the percentage of the total possible points, as follows:

Grade Percentage	Letter Grade	Description	
100% - 90%	A	The student fully understands the content and the course objectives are mastered and completed.	
89% - 80%	В	The student understands the content and the course objectives are completed at an above average level.	
79% - 70%	C	The student understands the course content and the course objectives are completed at an average level.	
69% - 60%	D	The student understands the course content at a below average level and a minimum of course objectives are met or completed.	
59% - 0%	F	The student has not met a sufficient number of course objectives to pass a minimum level and receives no credit.	

Late Work/Retake Policy: Learning to meet deadlines and accepting responsibility for actions and choices are very important life lessons. If you have extenuating/special circumstances for your work to be late, please talk with me **BEFORE** the due date. Life happens and I want to work with you and support you. Procrastinating or simply forgetting to do the work does **NOT** count as a special circumstance. Test and Quiz retakes are discussed on a case-by-case basis; again, procrastinating or forgetting to study does not mean an automatic retake. All tests and quizzes must be taken in class. The teacher reserves the right to (1) lower a student's grade for failure to participate and (2) not to accept or to lower the grade of assignments submitted late. All late work submitted will receive a score of 50% F.

Class Expectations: Learning a language is mostly a matter of practice. The most successful students are the ones who spend the most time practicing. Active class participation is a good start. Out of class work will be required, especially if you wish to do well. Plan to practice for thirty minutes every day. Remember that you are learning; that means that you will make mistakes. Mistakes are normal and to be expected. Do not be afraid to ask questions; do not be

afraid to try. Attend class every day and turn in all course work on time; if you are tardy or absent, *you* are responsible for any work or information missed. You *MUST* excuse all absences through the school attendance office. If you do not promptly excuse the absence it will be considered 'unexcused'; work/exams due on the day of an unexcused absense will be considered late work.

## Other:

- No food or beverages are allowed in class except for plain, unflavored water.
- Cell phones and other personal devices are to be OFF and AWAY during class.
