#### Course Description:

This course is designed to help you understand how the Modern World has been built by past events and how the study of history can be an invigorating and troubling endeavor. You will learn about major recent world events, the various people, places and ideas that shaped such events, and how these events directly impact the world we live in today. You will learn to read history through various primary and secondary sources and to establish your own view and understanding based on your growing skillset and classroom activities designed to stimulate higher order thinking.

#### Practices and Routines:

Each unit will be comprised of a wide variety of primary and secondary sources including textbooks, short videos, songs, poems, art, cartoons, photographs and other ephemera that historians use to uncover and consider the past. Our activities will vary depending on the sources we are studying and the skills we are attempting to build and refine. We will establish practices/habits for your thinking, reading, writing, and speaking that will make you a more forceful and considerate citizen of the world. Each day we have a chance to challenge ourselves and aid our classmates in the struggle to become a critical thinker and an engaged learner.

#### Unit Assessments:

Throughout the year, you will complete mastery projects. These can take the form of presentations, artwork, essays, video creations, websites, fliers, posters etc. Choice will be enshrined with a high value so you can do work that most interests you as a burgeoning learner. Tests and quizzes will also be a component of the course and will most often be delivered through Schoology.
