#### Course Description:

Explore literature through the medium of graphic novels, comics, and manga. Analyze the different forms of visual storytelling as a writer, reader, and comic book editor. Discover how comics have evolved and the important role they play in history and cultures.

#### Late work/Retake Expectations:

Students that turn in work beyond the due date can receive a lower grade. Each week the assignment is not turned in will reduce the score a full grade. All late work needs to be completed by the end of the quarter for credit.

LATE WORK STEPS:

- a) Send Mr. Helfman an email with the subject "late work: period number"
- b) Title of Assignment being turned in late
- c) Notify where assignment was turned in: "Schoology or turn-in bin"
- d) Explain the reason why the assignment was turned in late.
- e) Share what could you do differently next time
- f) Tell Mr. Helfman how he can be helpful

Students can retake formative assessments depending on an individual's situation. If they advocate for themselves and come to an agreement with Mr. Helfman, one retake will be allowed. Retakes may have the assignment adjusted by Mr. Helfman and will need to be done in person.

If a student was absent or unable to submit the work on the due date, they must meet with Mr. Helfman to discuss the situation and come to a solution.
