Course Description: this course will introduce students to topics and methods of data collection, organization, analysis, and presentation. The course will focus on descriptive statistics. Topics covered include categorical data, frequency tables, two-way tables, simple and compound probability, univariate data plots, measures of center and spread, variability, and the normal model.

Course Requirements:

Daily activities will include note-taking, individual and group assignments, Desmos activities, and quizzes. We will use online Desmos a lot so students must bring their Chromebooks to class fully charged. There will be four major tests and a final exam. *Check Schoology regularly for notes, assignments, and announcement.*

Grading and Gradebook:

"Tasks" = 40% of your final grade

- Classwork, homework, group activities, quizzes, etc.

Make Up / Late / Retake Policies
