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Required Textbooks/Materials: Chromebook, texts as assigned, lined paper, and pencils.

Course Description – Language Arts 9 covers the skills required for fluid Reading, Writing, Speaking, Listening, and Language (grammar and vocabulary) skills that are necessary for future learning, working, and state assessment.

Course Requirements – Read daily, participate in work as assigned. Write Narrative Essay, Expository Essay, and various shorter pieces of writing for summation and reflection. Participate in Speaking and Listening exercises and activities, Grammar and Vocabulary as assigned.

Grading Policy Description – I use an Equity grading scale of 5 points: grading categories are weighted as follows:

Mastery – 65% (Tests, Projects and Proficiency in Standards.)

Classwork – 20% (All assignments in class.)

Homework - 5% (Any work that requires parent involvement.)
