Scene Study: Acting & Directing

Building Relationships for Academic Success

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Required Textbooks/Materials -

All course material, including scripts, textbooks, and other writing/art materials will be provided in class. If any readings are assigned outside of class, they will be made available via email or Schoology.

Course Description -

Students will learn the basics of Acting in multiple styles/genres of theatre, and how to study, devise, perform, critique and revise pieces of theatre works. The styles of theatre that will be covered in class include:

- 1. Ensemble Building
- 2. Pantomime
- 3. Improvisational Theatre
- 4. Monologues
- 5. Duo/group scenes
- 6. One Acts
- 7. Scene Study and performance
- 8. Stage Combat

Every year we will study a different founder of Modern Theatre. These will also be on a 4-year rotation. Artists included in the founder category of Modern Theatre include:

- 1. Uta Hagen
- 2. Stella Adler
- 3. Viola Spolin
- 4. Konstantin Stanislavski

Course Requirements -

For a more detailed outline of the activities and subjects covered in class, look at the Course Schedule below.

In a typical class period, students will:

- Go over High & Lows and connect with one another.
- Play 1-2 Warm Up games (10 min.),
- Learning subject matter or working on performances (20-25 min).
- Spending the majority of class working on assigned pieces or exercises (30-40 min.)
- Close out class with an Exit Ticket and goal for the next day (10-15 min.).

There will be a performance assessment for the end of each unit. If time is allotted, there will also be the opportunity for class-wide critique and a revised performance of the same piece.

Students are required to attend the RHS Main Stage/Black Box Theatre Department productions. Attendance for all Acting and StageCraft students is free.

Students interested in the Directing Section of this course can be expected to learn all the same material but will apply it from a directing point of view.

- When it comes to performances, each director will be assigned specific actors/scene groups.
- The Director's job is to work with the actors, offering feedback and helping groups to improve.
- Directors are required to give feedback on performance days.
- Directors will provide reflections on the growth of the group and actors during the rehearsal and performance process, and how they helped those actors to grow.

Grading Policy Description -

No homework will be assigned outside of class. All assigned tasks will be able to be worked on during class time. This is a performance-based class - students must be present in class in order to receive points toward a letter grade.

20% = Classwork - rehearsal time, participation, reflections/critique, Exit Tickets, attendance of mainstage productions etc.

Final Performances = 40% of grade overall - performances, Screen Analysis Reflection, Year-End Reflection, etc.

There will be classwork in class, and Mastery of the given work will be within the parameters of their performances in class.

Performances will be graded based on the ITS judge rubric, and according to CTE standards. Rubrics and criteria for performances will be made known and passed out prior to performance dates in class. You will know exactly what is expected from you based on each rubric.

Assignments for Mastery will be:

- (1) Pantomime Performance (Oct. 5 & 6)
- (2) Improv Game Performance (Oct. 26 & 27)
- (3) Monologue/Duo Scene Draft Performance (Nov. 13-17)
- (4) Monologue/Duo Scene Final Performance (Dec. 14 & 15)
- (5) One Act Performances (Jan. 24-26)
- (6) Scene Analysis Performances (Apr. 15-19)
- (7) Stage Combat Performances (May 28-31)
- (8) Year-End Reflection Presentations (Jun. 3-7)

This opportunity is for students that earn a "D" or higher in at least 4 (or half) of the rubric scoring areas. There is no limit to the number of redo's you may attempt to get the grade that is most acceptable to you.
