

Course: Government (1 semester, <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> credit, required to graduate) Instructor: Evan Selby

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**Course Description:** This course studies the creation of American Government and the major institutions and processes in American Government. It includes the study of the United States Constitution and the Bill of Rights, the Legislative, Executive and Judicial branches of government, the electoral process and voting. Students explore ways to participate in American government and respectfully discuss current events.

# <u>Grading and Assessment Practices</u>—Grading is weighted with the following categories:

- Classwork/reading notes = **30%**
- Flocabulary activities = **15%** (used to introduce topics; **<u>must earn at least 70%</u>** on each Flocabulary assignment to earn credit)
- Structured Academic Controversies = 15% (used to teach civic dialogue and learn about current events; these are in-person activities and can't be made up online)
- Quizzes = 10% (reading notes and handouts can be used on quizzes/tests)
- Summative evaluation/project = 25%
  - Bill of Rights Test = 10% (must memorize all rights and pass with 100%, can take multiple times)
  - Persuasive Essay = 15% (this will be our <u>semester final</u>)
- POWER expectations = 5%
