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Course Description:

Students are provided an individually designed program to meet his or her needs in accordance with the Individualized Education Plan (IEP). The program offers individual and small group instruction as well as general classroom instruction. The focus is to assist student in achieving reading and writing skills that can be applied to core curriculum and in real life situations.

Course Requirements:

A variety of materials will be used to meet the Common Core State Standards listed below. Materials include various forms of literary and non-fiction texts, reading and writing curriculum, and listening and speaking exercises. Students will be required to have an independent reading book at their appropriate reading levels.

Common Core State Standards Addressed in Course:

9-10.RL.1 Cite strong and thorough textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text.

9-10.RL.2 Determine a theme or central idea of a text and analyze in detail its development over the course of the text, including how it emerges and is shaped and refined by specific details; provide an objective summary of the text.

Reading: Using a variety of literary and nonfiction texts, students will identify, explain and analyze the different aspects of reading. Emphasis will be placed on the six benchmark reporting categories:

- Vocabulary
- Read to perform a task
- Demonstrate general understanding
- Develop an interpretation
- Examine content and structure for information text
- Examine content and structure for literary text

Writing: Students will participate in various on-demand writing assignments. Emphasis will be placed on the six benchmark reporting categories:

- Ideas and Content
- Organization
- Voice
- Word choice
- Sentence fluency
- Conventions

Plagiarism and cheating not allowed. Students will receive a zero on any assignment that has been plagiarized or on which they have cheated. Please ask teacher for assistance to avoid making a mistake that can cause you to lose credit for an assignment.
