The enclosures contain the newly redesigned Oregon Department of Education's Report Card. The comprehensive redesign includes the following features:

- School Profile is meant to provide an overview of the school's most significant characteristics—those aspects that are likely to impact student test scores or other academic outcomes.
- *Overall State Rating* provides a summary measure of student performance.
- Academic Progress describes the extent to which students are making progress on standards-based tests.
- *Outcomes* reports key measures of success for all students and student subgroups.
- Curriculum and Learning Environment characterizes the school's programs, resources, and additional associated indicators of success.

We are proud to report that Reynolds Learning Academy's students demonstrated the following successes:

- An increase in 5 Year Cohort Graduation Rate for English Learner from a low of 8.3% to 70%.
- An increase in 5 Year Cohort Graduation rate for Latino students from 26.9% to 67.7%.
- An increase in passing scores on the OAKS Reading test from 32% to 42.5%.
- 87.3% of students showing Growth on the OAKS Math Assessment.

Dear Parents and Community Members,

Thank you for taking the time to review the Oregon Department of Education Report Card for Reynolds Learning Academy. Upon review, you will find that RLA has realized growth in our graduation rate, increasing from 20% to 36.4% in our four-year cohort rate and 35.1% to 49.4% in our five-year cohort rate. In addition, RLA students increased their passing rate on the State Reading Assessment from 32.6% passing to 42.5% passing and also realized a slight increase in our passing rate on the State Assessment in Math.

As encouraging as this data is with regard to our increased student performance, it is far from our overall goal of ensuring that each

and every child is successful and graduates with the skills necessary to continue their educational path beyond high school. We are excited at some of the initial growth represented within this report and are continuing work to align curriculum to strengthen the academic experience.


