FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

2014--15 proved to be very successful for RMS on many different fronts. Below, I will highlight a few of the successes:

- \cdot School wide, RMS students continued to show measurable reading growth; virtually all students achieved at least a year's growth with many others closing achievement gaps by at least one third.
- \cdot With additional math intervention classes added, most RMS students showed tangible growth in mathematics.
- \cdot RMS Fall Parent--Teacher Conferences were attended at a rate of 81%, the highest for the school in at least 10 years.
- \cdot RMS had almost 100 fewer disciplinary referrals than in the previous year; 82% of students received no disciplinary referrals whatsoever.
- · The SUN Program served nearly 500 students after school, offering both academic and enrichment opportunities.
- · The RMS Advanced Orchestra Program won 3rd place at the Mt. Hood Orchestra Festival-the

highest placing ever for an RMS group!

In spite of previous successes we know that we need to accelerate student achievement in both reading and mathematics and are committed to doing so. Thus, we have crafted a master schedule wherein students who need it will have 84 minutes of Language Arts or Reading and 84 minutes of Mathematics daily! Additionally, we have added additional math intervention classes at all three grade levels to further support our students in their mainstream mathematics courses. Lastly, we continue to build upon our AVID program (Advancement Via Individual Determination). The AVID Program is designed to help put students on a trajectory toward college. This year we are implementing AVID strategies school wide to further support students with reading, writing, and study skills. We are excited by the possibilities we are able to provide, moving toward Model School status, and more importantly helping place each and every student on a path toward college and career readiness.



SCHOOL READINESS

Reynolds Middle School offers the following student supports to serve students' physical, social, and emotional well being:
Free breakfast and lunch to all students, Friday Food Pantry for all RMS families, counseling and diverse student support groups, comprehensive anti-bullying program, PBIS (Positive Behavior

Intervention Support), School Nursing, semester long Physical Education and Health.

ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Reynolds Middle School provides an extensive program of academic interventions in Reading, Mathematics, and English Language Development both during the school day and in its after school SUN Program. Among the offerings: Tiered Title 1 Reading, Leveled Mathematics Intervention, Leveled English Language Development ranging from Newcomers to levels 4-5. Comprehensive Special Education supporting students in Reading, Mathematics, Writing, and in their Social/Emotional needs.

ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

Advanced Language Arts and Mathematics are offered at all three grade levels. 8th grade students who successfully completed Advanced Math receive credit for High School Algebra.

Spanish is offered for students grades 6-8 at three

different levels. Students who successfully complete Spanish 1 as 8th graders can receive high school credit. AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination) is offered at the 7th and 8th grade levels. SUN's (Schools Uniting Neighborhoods) After School Academy provides reading and math intervention, and an extensive list of elective/exploratory offerings based on student interest.
