

## WHAT SHOULD I REPORT?



# Did you see or hear something that makes you worry a classmate might get hurt (or hurt someone) but you're not sure who to tell? SafeOregon is listening.

It might be a worry about self-harm/suicidal thoughts, drug use, bullying, sexual harassment, fighting, weapons at school, or even threat of a school attack. Report the information by phone, text, email, mobile app or on the SafeOregon webpage. *NOTE: This tip line is not for emergencies! If you need immediate help, dial 9-1-1.* 

# WHO ANSWERS MY CALL?



### A specially trained call taker will receive your tip, 24 hours a day / 7 days a week. Even on weekends, holidays, and school breaks!

The call takers have years of experience answering these type of calls. The call taker may have follow-up questions to make sure there is enough information to take action. The more information provided, the better. You can even include a photo or video clip if you have one!

#### WHERE DOES THE TIP GO?



#### The tip will be passed along to the school!

The call taker sends the information to specially chosen school staff (often the principal and/or school counselors). If the tip is really serious, law enforcement may be called. Don't worry, staff who receive the tip care about protecting your identity.

## WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?



### The school (and/or law enforcement) will determine what to do next with the information.

Thanks to you, the information is in the hands of those who are trained to respond to these type of situations. Together, we make schools and students safer.
