FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Community Members,

It is my honor and privilege to serve as your principal for the second year. The mission of Walt Morey Middle School is to provide a meaningful and challenging learning environment that supports and empowers all students in achieving their fullest potential. As principal, I am committed to ensuring that we fulfill our mission.

One of our deepest beliefs at Walt Morey is that positive relationships between students and staff are at the core of all learning. Our 6th grade self contained classrooms, as well as teaming and looping in 7th and 8th grade, help to foster a family atmosphere in which these relationships are able to grow and thrive. By knowing our students well, we are better able to individualize their education and meet the needs of our diverse group of learners.

One of our biggest initiatives this year is to improve our reading achievement by creating a school-wide culture of reading. The best way to become a better reader is to simply read more. Walt Morey students

are given time in homeroom each week for sustained silent reading and we ask that students read a minimum of 120 minutes per week at home. Parents are asked to support the school by ensuring that students complete their nightly reading requirement. Teachers will regularly meet with students to measure their growth and coach them one-on-one about their strengths and weaknesses as a reader.

This year we will strengthen our professional learning community model as we focus our efforts on closing the achievement gap. Through an emphasis on literacy, sheltered instruction, technology integration, AVID organizational strategies, and positive school culture, we will ensure that all students are challenged to meet their academic potential and are equipped with the tools necessary for 21st century success.


