Greetings Mustangs,

I want to begin by wishing you all a happy Thanksgiving and a joyous holiday season. As 2015 draws to a close, I hope you find time to relax and spend time with loved ones near and far. I, myself, am looking forward to visiting family in both Southern California and Las Vegas during the winter break.

Thank you to all of the parents who attended our student led conferences. This year we had 74% parent participation, which is a fantastic turn out! It was wonderful to see so many families come in to support their child's academic progress in school. We appreciate your partnership in the education of your child.

I also appreciate those of you who stopped to fill out a parent survey. One of my own professional goals this year is to improve parent and community partnerships. I was encouraged to see so much positive parent feedback about the culture of our school. Of the 167 parents who completed the survey:

- 99% feel welcome at school.
- 98% are able to get the information they need.
- 93% say their child feels safe at school.
- 91% say their kids believe the staff cares about them.
- 98% believe the staff has the necessary skills to support their child's academic needs.
- 93% believe behaviors are addressed appropriately.

Some areas of strength that were noted repeatedly were: great teachers, supportive and caring staff, communication with families, strong academics, feeling of community within the school, cleanliness of the school, organization, and ParentVue. Areas that you asked us to improve upon were: more electives and TAG offerings, more sports and after school activities, more homework help for students, help with ParentVue, and improved handling of bullying and other serious issues. We appreciate your input as we work to better meet the needs of our diverse students and their families.

I would also like to give special recognition to all of our hardworking students for their commitment to academic discipline. In the first quarter, 205 students (about a third of the student body) accomplished all As and Bs on their report card. These students were celebrated on Tuesday, November 24th, with a B's or Better doughnut party. Additionally, 212 students had a 3.5 or better GPA, earning a prestigious honor roll recognition. These students will receive a certificate, Honor Roll bracelet, and a VIP pass for activity day. To all of these students and their families, the Walt Morey staff is very proud of your accomplishments!

Finally, I would like to give a special shout out to Barb Lim and the leadership class for their very successful Help the Homeless drive. With the generosity of all of our families and the support of our homeroom teachers, they have been able to collect 3419 donations to date. Classrooms who are in the lead for the most donations are 6th Grade Mrs. Pierce, 7th Grade Mrs. Rispler, 8th Grade Mrs. Dickinson. Thank you to all of the Walt Morey community for your participation in helping our needlest families.

Como 2015 llega a su fin, espero que encuentre tiempo para relajarse y pasar tiempo con sus seres queridos cerca y lejos. Yo mismo estoy deseando volver a visitar a mi familia, en el sur de California y Las Vegas, durante las vacaciones de invierno.

¡Gracias a todos los padres que asistieron a nuestros conferencias. Este año hemos tenido 74% de participación de los padres, que es una participación fantastica! Fue maravilloso ver a tantas familias apoyar el progreso académico de sus hijos en la escuela. Agradecemos su colaboración en la educación de su hijo.

También aprecio aquellos de ustedes que se tomaron el tiempo de llenar una encuesta escolar. Uno de mis objetivos profesionales este año es mejorar las asociaciones de padres y de la comunidad. De los 167 padres que completaron la encuesta, me animo a ver tantos comentarios/sugerencias positivas de los padres acerca de la cultura de nuestra escuela.

- 99% se sienten bienvenidos en la escuela.
- 98% son capaces de obtener la información que necesitan.
- 93% dicen que su hijo se siente seguro en la escuela.
- 91% dice que sus hijos creen que el personal se preocupa por ellos.
- 98% cree que el personal tiene las habilidades necesarias para apoyar las necesidades académicas de sus hijos.
- 93% cree que se da la atención debida al comportamiento estudiantil.

Algunas áreas destrezas que se observó en varias ocasiones fueron: buenos maestros, apoyo y cuidado de parte del personal, comunicación con las familias, académicos fuertes, sentimiento de comunidad dentro de la escuela, la limpieza de la escuela, organización y ParentVue. Las áreas en que podemos mejorar fueron: más clases electivos y TAG, más deportes y actividades después de la salida de clases, más ayuda con la tarea para estudiantes, ayuda con ParentVue, y un mejorar el trato de bullying y otros problemas graves. Apreciamos sus sugerencias a medida que trabajamos para satisfacer mejor las necesidades de nuestros diversos estudiantes y sus familias.

También me gustaría dar un reconocimiento especial a todos nuestros estudiantes por su sentido de compromiso hacia la disciplina académica. En el primer trimestre, 205 estudiantes (alrededor de un tercio de los estudiantes) sacaron A's y B's en su boleta de calificaciones. 

Immunization News

Letters will be mailed to parents whose children have incomplete immunization information. Should you receive a letter, please provide the requested information as soon as possible. The school nurse is available on most Wednesdays to address any questions that you may have or to help identify a health care provider.

<u>Immunization Update—Nonmedical exemptions</u>

Recent legislation resulting from Senate Bill 895 has now changed the requirements for non-medical exemptions, formerly known as religious exemptions. Parents of students who were previously on a religious exemption status prior to March 1, 2015 and wish to continue with an exemption are now required to obtain a medical exemption, or obtain a Vaccine Education Certificate after receiving the required education about immunizations from a health care practitioner or after watching the online vaccine education module.
