



# SCHOOL READINESS

Woodland has a very strong PBIS (Positive Behavior and Intervention Supports) program in place that helps creative a positive, nurturing environment. We also have anti-bullying curriculum in place that is taught throughout the year.

#### ACADEMIC SUPPORT

Woodland is changing the way we instruct our ESL students. ESL teachers will be pushing into classrooms to work with small groups of ESL students on specific targets that align to what they're learning in the classroom. Woodland will offer math and language arts after school programs in the Fall, Winter, and Spring. This year the SMART (Start Making a Reader Today) reading program will provide students with one-on-one adult readers to give more individual attention and instruction in reading. Our new SUN program will be working hard this year to forge long-lasting community partnerships to help increase the success of our students.

#### ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

Woodland is extremely excited to be partnering with the SUN (Schools Uniting Neighborhoods) program beginning this year. This program will help to increase our offering of academic and enrichment programs. In addition to offering after school math and language arts classes this year, we will be offering art and PE enrichment classes as well. Some of the specific programs we will offer will be: SMART (Start Making a Reader Today), Chess for Success, OSU Health Extension classes, and Columbia Slough Watershed Council Outreach. Our PTA will also be helping to fund academic-based field trips for all of our grade levels.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES/ AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The addition of the SUN program this year will help to facilitate a variety of enrichment classes in both athletics and the arts.
