You may hear your child mention a lesson they are learning in Team Kids and wonder what that means. Every classroom of students has one-half hour of Team Kids each week. The lessons are taught by Mrs. Larsen, the School Counselor, in your child's regular classroom. The lessons are activity-based and are focused on learning to be good citizens in the world.
